RICHMOND INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

With more than seven major airlines flying into the Richmond Region, getting to Richmond from practically anywhere has never been easier.

Richmond International is a world-class airport that features 200 flights daily, with all major carriers and low-cost carriers Southwest Airlines, JetBlue and Allegiant, giving you plenty of convenient options. Airport amenities include free airport-wide Wi-Fi service, an Inter-Faith Chapel, full-service banking offering foreign currency exchange and ATM facilities, USO Center for active duty and retired military personnel, and a Richmond Region Visitor Information Center. RIC is conveniently located less than 20 minutes by car from downtown Richmond.

RICHMOND AMTRAK

With three Amtrak Stations located in the Richmond Region, visitors can sit back and relax as they enjoy their trip to Richmond by rail. Amtrak stations are located just off I-95 at downtown’s historic Main Street Station, minutes from the I-95 and I-64 junction at the Staples Mill Station, and in the north end of the region in Ashland. Arrivals from the north include Washington, D.C.; Philadelphia; New York City; and Boston. Arrivals from the south include Raleigh, NC; Columbia, SC; Tampa, FL; and Orlando, FL.

AUTOMOBILE

At the junction of Interstates 64 and 95, the Richmond Region is within a day’s drive of half the U.S. population, including major metropolitan areas such as New York City and Atlanta. It’s also within a two-hour drive of the Atlantic Ocean, Blue Ridge Mountains and our nation’s capital, Washington D.C.
